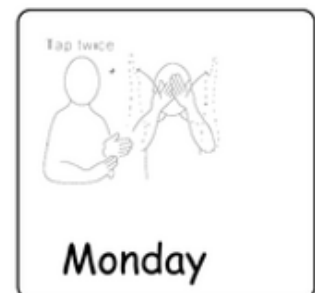
We are so proud of Miss Frost who has completed her Apple Teacher badges! Well done!

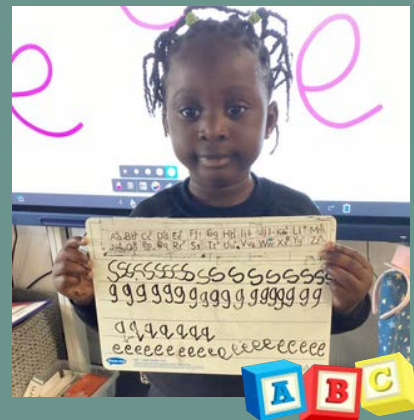
