
Year 1 have also made an exciting start on their new Digital Postcard project, which is already capturing their enthusiasm. We look forward to sharing more information about this work with you very soon.

This week in RE, we discussed why churches are sacred to Christians as we prepared for our trip to visit Christ Church.




Year 2

Year 1 enjoyed their trip to Christ Church which brought their RE learning to life. Thank you to all the parents that supported our trip!


MAGMA MATHS VISIT
