Banana Pancake Recipe

Serves 1 1/2 banana 1 eggs 1/2 teaspoon Baking powder 50g Self raising flour Low fat yoghurt – I tablespoon

Method

Ingredient

Mash up the banana until quite smooth. Mix in the eggs, baking powder and self raising flour until you get a smoother

Pour small amount into a hot pan. You can make them quite thick like an American pancake. When you see bubbles starting to form, look underneath, when browned turn over and cook the other side.

Place on a plate, add the yoghurt and berries to taste.
